What The Vote! volunteers can look forward to another opportunity to engage young voters



in democracy for a most exciting voting year! Many of the high school students registered in Fall 2019 will be able to vote in the Presidential Primary in March 2020 and the Idaho Primary election in May. Volunteers will be in classrooms and on college campuses again in Fall 2020 just in time for the General election.

In the meantime, the WTV! website is in development with plans to be active by March 1st. Members of the Student Advisory Committee are helping with the development to help us ensure the website appeals to our target audience – young voters!

Planning has begun for WTV! to deliver a "Skill Building" workshop to high school students who will be attending the <u>Andrus Center for Public Policy's Young Women and Leadership</u> <u>Conference</u> (young men can also attend). The workshop will inspire engagement in democracy. We have several activities planned which include help from two students from our Student Advisory Committee. We are excited to have this opportunity to share our message to this group of "engaged" students.

We have over 100 AAUW and community volunteers on our WTV! list now and continue to add volunteers. Phone # is 208-283-2580. A kick-off event in August will provide training and teams will form to start the registration activities in September 2020.



I recently had the opportunity to tour the <u>Discovery Center of Idaho</u> and met with the volunteer coordinator, Cortney Olson. Cortney is a former recipient of an AAUW scholarship, and she was very excited to learn that AAUW is supportive of STEM in Idaho. The Discovery Center is looking for volunteers, and I am working on setting up an opportunity for AAUW members to be more active in the STEM community. Stay tuned for upcoming details.

The Discovery Center will be having their annual <u>Science with Style Gala</u> on February 28, 2020. There will be a 3-course dinner, silent and live auctions, and a science demonstration. The funds raised go to STEM programs at the Center.

Boise State Food Pantry by Tracy Bicknell-Holmes



When the <u>Associated Students of Boise State University (ASBSU)</u> and Dean of Students learned that many of their classmates faced food insecurity, the student leadership group formed the Food Insecurities Initiative and the student food pantry was born. This is a student-led project, and your food donations help restock the pantry each month.

In addition to the Food Pantry, a lot is going on at Boise State to help students with Food Insecurity. Announced on November 7, 2019, in the Boise State UPDATE, a *new app will help end food waste on campus and feed hungry students*. The app called **Bronco BEAM**



(or "beacon environment approximation mapping") was developed by GIMMworks students Issiac Torrero, Tyler Chapman, and Olivia Thomas. Students download the app to their cell phones. When food is left over from a catered event, a Food Alert message goes out to anyone in the vicinity with the app on their phone telling them when and where food is available. Students can go to that location and eat for free, no questions asked. Food insecure employees can also use the app. Less food goes to waste and hungry people eat. It's a win-win. <u>GIMMworks</u> is part of the Gaming Interactive Media and Mobile (GIMM) technology program at Boise State in the College of Innovation and Design. Former BSU President Bob Kustra asked GIMMworks to develop apps that address the most pressing needs on campus.

BroncosGrow is a new initiative to develop a campus garden to enhance the environment, offer educational opportunities, and provide fresh produce to students. Research has shown a correlation between students who eat more fruits and vegetables and higher-grade point averages. A campus garden has been approved, the curriculum has been developed, and the land has been designated. A fundraising campaign ran in December with a goal to raise \$5,000 to get the garden started.
