## **Idaho Capitol Steps**

I hope everyone had a happy and safe holiday and was able to spend some time with friends and family. Who knew the pandemic would last this long?

We are planning on holding the January 12th lunch meeting in person again. We will again require that everyone wear a mask except when eating or drinking, and we will check vaccine status at the door. However, if you showed proof of vaccination at the December Holiday Luncheon, you will not have to show it again. Those who have not been vaccinated will have to show proof of a negative COVID test within the 48 hours prior to the meeting. If interest groups are meeting in person, the Board also encourages them to follow these safety guidelines for vaccination and mask-wearing.

We will not be serving box lunches in January, since there was an issue with the quality in December. In fact, the hotel has given us a discount on those lunches, which we will pass on to those members who bought lunches in December when they buy a lunch in January.

January means the start of a new legislative session. In preparation, I attended a webinar with the national office on AAUW's role in lobbying. They stressed that, although we are non-partisan, we are political since we support measures to increase equity for women and girls.

The Idaho legislative session opens at noon on January 10th. Jane Post, our Public Policy Chair, will post information about the session on <u>our Facebook page</u>, so be sure to check it if you are a member

of the AAUW Idaho Statehouse Lobby Corps or just interested in what the legislature is doing. AAUW Idaho will hold a legislative meeting on January 22d. I hope to see many of you wearing your blue AAUW shirts in the Capitol starting in January.

# What The Vote! Update by Chris Stokes and Nancy Viano



What The Vote! (WTV!) registration activities in the schools were completed in October 2021. However, there is still work going on behind the scenes to introduce a new enhancement to the program to teachers locally and statewide.

Thanks to an anonymous donor, WTV! worked with the Gimm Lab at Boise State University to create "All In Favor." The purpose of the tool is to provide an interactive format to encourage civil discussion and informed debate in the classrooms. While the initial target for the tool was the government high school senior classes, we have learned that teachers believe they can use this tool for any class where civil discourse and civic engagement can be promoted. Basically, it is one more weapon in the teacher's arsenal of tools that promote civil discourse about political or other issues.

Idaho Public Television (IPTV) staff are talking with us about potential options to showcase this tool for educators throughout the state. Recent discussions about venues to promote All in Favor include their education department, civic literacy project and through their web and on-air venues. You can visit the All In Favor to get an idea of how the tool works.

We are excited that this unique tool may soon be shared throughout Idaho as an option for teachers to design their own discussion topics and allow students to experience the benefits of informed decision-making after robust and civil discussion.

WTV! activities typically take place during late summer through mid October. In the meantime, we encourage our passionate WTV! volunteers to engage with AAUW Idaho Lobby Corps activities this winter when the Idaho legislature returns.

We are looking forward to robust registration activities in the fall as we

move into another important election. WTV! is not possible without the almost 100 terrific volunteers so please: Stay warm! Stay healthy!
