And that's a wrap....or the 2024 Idaho legislative session isn't done

It has been an incredibly difficult legislative session as we worked on our 2024 priority issues - healthcare for women, libraries, education vouchers/tax credits, and voting rights. We just didn't fare that well this year. As I write this article, the legislature has not gone sine di and the last two weeks of the session were held at breakneck speed, sometimes bills disappeared, and some were resurrected numerous times, heard in strategically chosen committees, and legislative leaders worked in plain sight as well as hidden behind caucus doors and offices. However, AAUW Boise Branch members were busy at their keyboards writing email after email to committees and the House and Senate, and sometimes we showed up to testify in person. We must remain part of the great democratic process that is the Idaho legislature and never cede the legislative arena to anyone. They are we and we are they, whether they or we like it or not.

Thanks for receiving and acting on texts late in the session and for showing up in the committee rooms. Often there is no other way to be part of the process.

H633 - Medicaid support for pregnancy and post partum

Bills defeated

H415/S1418 - Guns in Schools

H419 - Repeal of Medicaid Expansion

H447 - Tax credit school vouchers

H667 - Eliminate no excuse absentee voting (maybe)
