Over 40% of the 150 people in attendance were non-members who generously donated to our cause so please thank them the next time you see them. Brian's 'ask (with math?) 'at the end of the evening brought in \$10,000! Last but not least, the musicians were fabulous and added such a comforting and calming mood to the room.

Bottom line net income from the Spring Fling was just over \$21,800!!! All of this money will go a long way to funding the futures of more women like our three grateful and inspiring speakers we heard from at the gala: Ohana Wright, Isabella Deckelman, and Sierra Robles. Thank you to everyone for your generous support!

As we close out another year, I would like to let members know how much they have supported STEM in Boise. This year we were able to give \$2,000 to the Girl Scouts of Silver Sage for their excellent STEM summer camps, which get bigger and better every summer.

We gave \$1,000 to the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Boise. As I have reported in earlier articles, BBBS began a STEM program in which the little sisters are given opportunities to learn from mentors in STEM fields. BBBS is continuing to expand this program,

Our final donation was to the Idaho 99s, a group of women pilots who are very active in STEM events. This donation will fund scholarships for the young girls who participate in their summer camps, as well as help fund the group's participation in events like SheTech.

Lastly, I would like to give a shout out to the Needleworkers and Bowlers for their support of STEM (full disclosure – I am in both groups). Over the year, the bowlers donated \$230 to STEM. The Needleworkers and all of our members who purchased our needlework projects at the general meetings donated a whopping \$1,080. Thanks to everyone for their support.

If you are confused on when to renew your AAUW membership, you are not alone! Here's a quick guideline to help:

*If you joined prior to July 1, 2022, your renewal date is June 30th each year.

*If you joined or rejoined after July 1, 2022, your renewal date is the last day of your anniversary month (rounded up or down).

Both AAUW National and the Boise Branch will remind you by email when it's time to renew. If you want to check your renewal date, you can look it up on AAUW National's website – <u>my.aauw.org</u>. As a convenience, when your membership renewal dues are due, you can pay the \$113 renewal cost online through my.aauw.org or you can send a check directly to the Boise Area Branch, P. O. Box 16548, Boise, ID 83715.
