President's Message by Martha Lund



Greetings from your president! I hope everyone is trying to stay calm and stress-free in the days before the elections (or not, lol). This month's meeting has traditionally been dedicated to fundraising for the Inez Robb scholarship and this year is no exception. For those who are new, Inez Robb was a trailblazing journalist who went to high school in Boise and went to the University of Idaho. She became quite famous during WWII as a war correspondent and later as an international correspondent and columnist. She donated the seed money to the Boise Branch of AAUW to start a scholarship fund. That fund is being managed now by the Idaho Community Foundation and they determine the fund distribution percentage. The scholarship is awarded to a BSU junior or senior female through an application process managed by the Inez Robb Scholarship committee. A supplemental amount, usually raised at the April fundraiser, is also applied to the scholarship to cover one semester of tuition.

The recipient will speak at our April 2025 Gala. The more money we invest in the fund, the higher return we get, so we encourage members to contribute what they can. A gift basket donated by the Mahjongg group will go to a member who donates by raffle (in other words, everyone donating at the meeting will get a raffle ticket). Donations for the supplement will be accepted as well, but those donations must be specifically designated to go to the supplement.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to let me know how they liked the Happy Hour format last month. I've gotten all positive reviews, so we very likely will try it again later in the year. Also, thanks to all who participated in the League of Women Voters forums. We were given credit on their posters and social media for participating!
