Consequently, transgender people in most cities and states face legalized discrimination in nearly every aspect of their lives - discrimination in employment, housing, health care, education, legal systems, and even in their families.

Come to the February 18th meeting to learn about these transgender issues from someone who has first hand, up close, and personal knowledge and experience. Sara LaWall is the parent of a trans youth and is well versed in all that trans individuals face (medical, legal and psychological) as well as the current laws targeting our trans community. Now is the time to exercise our civic duties!

The Board of the Boise Branch of AAUW has chosen three policy issues on

which to focus during the 2025 Idaho State legislative session:

- 1. Women's/girls' healthcare especially as it relates to the current highly restrictive Idaho abortion laws that do not take into account the health of the mother when making medical decisions;
- 2. School funding proposals especially as they relate to schemes that would allow tax dollars to pay for private or religious schools;
- 3. Regressive policies that negatively impact women in higher education.

Please join our AAUW Lobby Corps. AAUW Idaho president Mary Mosley and I will send emails and texts to you asking that you participate as you can by writing emails to legislators both at the Committee level and House/Senate level. You might be asked to come down to the Capitol and provide support to members testifying. Perhaps you will decide to testify yourself, online or in person. Maybe writing a letter to the editor of one of our Idaho papers is something you could do. Notification of the need for any of these actions is often late in the day so always check your email or telephone to see if your action is needed.
