When Is Your Renewal Date? It Depends! by Nancy Gray



If you are unsure when your annual AAUW membership is due, here's a guideline to help:

- If you joined prior to July 1, 2022, your renewal date is June 30 each year.
- If you joined or rejoined after July 1, 2022, your renewal date is the last day of your anniversary month (rounded up or down).

Both AAUW National and the Boise Branch will remind you when it's time to renew. When you get these reminders, we would appreciate it if you would renew as soon as possible, although there is a grace period if you need more time. Renewal cost is \$115, which includes branch, state, and national AAUW membership.
